

Current Funding Opportunities: SALC

Sustainable Agricultural Lands Conservation (SALC) Program

California Department of Conservation and the Strategic Growth Council

Program Description

SALC protects agricultural lands from conversion to more GHG-intensive uses by facilitating conservation easements and strategy plans, providing direct protection of at-risk lands.

Goal

To support California's need for agricultural conservation, economic growth, and sustainable development

Application Process

Planning Grants: Pre-proposal worksheet; Application; Agreement template **Acquisition Grants**: Pre-proposal worksheet; Acquisition application; Agreement template; CARB quantification methodology.

Funding Amount

Planning Grants: Up to \$250,000

Acquisition Grants: No maximum award amount.

Application Timeline

Pre-proposals: Early summer

Applications: Late summer/early fall

Healthy Soils Program (HSP)

California Department of Food and Agriculture

Program Description

Incentives Program: Provides financial assistance for conservation management practices that improve soil health, sequester carbon and reduce greenhouse gas emissions.

Demonstration Projects: Compares the implementation of HSP practices to conventional practices and shares lessons learned with California farmers and rangers

Goal

To promote the development of healthy soils on California's farmlands and ranchlands

Application Process

Incentives Program: Applications accepted on a rolling basis and reviewed in the order of receipt.

Demonstration Projects: Applications collectively undergo a 4-month review process

Current Funding Opportunities: Forest Health

Forest Health Grant Program (Forest Legacy Program)

California Department of Forestry and Fire Protection (CAL FIRE)

Program Description

The Forest Health Program funds reforestation, forest fuel reduction, pest management, conservation easements and fee acquisitions, and forest biomass utilization.

Goal

To proactively restore forest health and conserve working forests, protect upper watersheds, promote carbon storage, and minimize forest carbon loss due to wildfires.

Application Process

Eligibility: Federal land management agencies, state land management agencies, Native American tribes, private forest landowners, resource conservation districts, fire safe councils, land trusts, landowner organizations, conservation groups, and nonprofits.

Variable

Current Funding Opportunities: FARMER

Funding Agricultural Replacement Measures for Emission Reductions (FARMER)

California Air Resources Board

Program Description:

FARMER funds harvesting equipment, trucks, pump engines, tractors, utility terrain vehicles (UTVs) and other equipment used in agricultural operations.

Goal:

To reduce emissions from the agricultural sector to improve air quality and reduce greenhouse gas emissions.

Application Process:

Local air districts administer the FARMER Program for their region and select funded projects. Contact your local air district for information on how to apply.

Funding Amount:

Varies by air district.

Application Timeline:

Varies by air district

Resources Available:

Air District staff may provide technical assistance to applicants as needed, including but not limited to, small growers in disadvantaged communities and low-income communities and households

Current Funding Opportunities: SAFER

Safe and Affordable Funding for Equity and Resilience (SAFER) Drinking Water Program

California State Water Resources Control Board

Program Description

Provides access to tools, funding sources, and regulatory authorities

Goal

To provide access to safe, accessible, and affordable drinking water for all Californians

Application Process

Pre-application through FAAST, followed by further staff assistance through the application process. Pre-applications can be submitted for a project at any stage

Funding Amount

No cap to funding amount

Application Timeline

Applications accepted year-round

Current Funding Opportunities: HVIP

Hybrid and Zero-Emission Truck and Bus Voucher Project (HVIP)

California Air Resources Board

Program Description

HVIP makes zero-emission and Low NOx buses/trucks as affordable as their fossil-fueled counterparts at point of sale through providing discount vouchers

Goal

To accelerate the adoption of cleaner, more-efficient trucks/buses

Application Process

Visit the CA HVIP website, select vehicle(s) from a catalog, contact affiliated vendors, provide vehicle domicile location & other info, purchase your vehicle!

Funding Amount

Variable according to vehicle type and "disadvantaged community" designation

Application Timeline

Anticipated early 2021

Current Funding Opportunities: CVRP

Clean Vehicle Rebate Project (CVRP)

California Air Resources Board

Program Description

CVRP offers rebates of up to \$7,000 for the purchase/lease of new, eligible zero-emission vehicles, including electric, plug-in hybrid electric and fuel cell vehicles.

Goal

To promote clean vehicle adoption in California

Application Process

Online application via the CVRP website

Eligibility: All CA residents and eligible fleets; Portion of funds reserved for DACs and Lower-income residents statewide

Funding Amount

Up to \$7,000 per eligible vehicle; One rebate limit per person

Application Timeline

Apply within 3 months of purchase/lease of an eligible vehicle and until rebate funds are exhausted

Goal

To enable under-resourced communities to build community-driven leadership, collaborative partnerships, knowledge, and skills to access public funding and engage in climate action

Application Process

Funding support, not a funding source

Runs in parallel with the program offering funds





- UNDERSTAND TITLE ISSUES
 - CONSIDER USING A REAL ESTATE-SAVVY ATTORNEY
 - RESEARCH THOROUGHLY & BE PREPARED TO ANSWER FOLLOW-UP QUESTIONS BY SALC STAFF
- LANDOWNERS: EVERYONE WILLING TO SIGN REQUIRED DOCUMENTS?
- SALC STAFF ARE RESOURCES, ASK FOR ASSISTANCE & FEEDBACK
